

# 2017 SHOW SUMMARY SHEET

Shows will start at 7:30 a.m. SHARP, Marshfield Show will start at 7:00a.m.

Measuring: Fridays 7:00p.m.-9:00 p.m.; Saturdays & Sundays As Needed.

**Numbers:** To obtain a number(s) a master registration form must be completed and sent with a copy of the signed waiver, registration papers, negative coggins and \$5/number (or \$10/number if requesting it at a show without pre-ordering it). This information should be sent to Rebecca Eckes. To save on postage, numbers will not be mailed. They can be picked up at Midwest Horse Fair or at any WPOAC show. There will be NO exceptions to this rule.

**Stalls:** Stalls must be reserved with the stall request form (found on website or in newsletter) with deposit. Stalls will not be reserved without a deposit. Stalls can be cancelled by phone to the show chairperson, until 6pm on the Wednesday before the show. Jump out fee is \$10 per Pony per Day.

**Shavings:** 2 Bags of shavings will be included in each pony stall (not included in tack stalls). Additional shavings are \$7/Bag and should be pre-ordered on the stall request form. A limited number of additional shavings will be available at each show; these will be given out on a first come first serve basis.

**Camping:** Camping is a per unit fee.

## **General Show Guidelines**

Only Registered POA's may show at POA shows, unless an IBC, which is open to all breeds.

Ponies without permanent height cards must be measured at each show, during designated measuring times.

The Show Committee reserves the right to combine or split any classes as deemed necessary.

Show grounds and the WPOAC are not responsible for any injuries or thefts.

**Novice Classes:** Riders who qualify for the National POAC youth program and have a Novice Eligibility Form on file with POAC are eligible to earn National Points in Nationally pointed Novice Events. A copy of the Novice Eligibility form must be on file with Rebecca Eckes prior to showing at a WPOAC show. Showmanship and Trail are NOT nationally pointed Novice Classes, so these will count only towards WPOAC high points. Any novice exhibitor can exhibit in Novice Classes in the State of Wisconsin, this will be overseen by the show committee and board of directors.

**Helmets:** ASTM/SEI approved safety helmets are required to be worn by youth in Hunt Classes and by all exhibitors in Timed and Jumping events.

**Sportsmanship:** Any person acting or inciting or permitting any other to act in a manner contrary to the Rules of the POAC, or in a manner deemed unsportsmanlike, improper, unethical, dishonest, or intemperate, or prejudicial to the best interests of the POAC, shall be reported to the POAC and subject to disciplinary procedures. (Rule 8, A (1) Pages 19-20 of the 2008 POAC Official Handbook).

**Leadline 6 & Under:** No rider may cross enter the same discipline in 6 & under and 9 & under classes.

**9 & Under:** An exhibitor is not allowed to participate in both the 9 & Under W/T/C and the W/T division in a specific discipline during the same show. However, it would be possible for an exhibitor to show 3-gait Western Pleasure and W/T Hunter Under Saddle or vice versa. Open Walk Trot is an exception.

**Multiple Riders:** A pony may be ridden by more than one rider in a discipline (ie Showmanship or Hunter Under Saddle), provided that the riders are in different age and/or gender divisions. It must be specified on a POAC point designation form prior to the start of the show. You can get a point designation form from the WPOAC website, Rebecca Eckes or a show chair. If a form is not on file all points will be forfeited.
